

The Zugspitze juts self-confidently from the eponymous mountain range in southern Bavaria and as Germany's highest mountain is famous well beyond the country's borders. Its popularity epitomizes the need people have to get some distance from their everyday lives and "rise above things". The spectacular ascent on the record-breaking Cable car Zugspitze marks the first highlight. Having reached an altitude of 2,962 metres in comfort, visitors are able to enjoy extensive views over 400 mountain peaks. Anyone wanting to experience glacial ice and snow up close can choose between sporty and laid-back activities - in winter and high summer. The Panorama 2962 restaurant at the summit stands for the best prospects on a scenic and culinary level. It will serve typical specialties from the Alpine region, garnished with rich panoramic views. The cogwheel train then takes you back in comfort to Garmisch-Partenkirchen - the perfect opportunity to wave farewell to the peak and to reflect on the experiences of your round trip.

ORA FT LABORA

Since its establishment by emperor Ludwig the Bavarian in I330, the monastery of Ettal has been the spiritual and cultural centre of the region. The towering peaks of the Ammergau Alps, the largest nature reserve in Bavaria, frame the abbey with its splendid ecclesiastical architecture. The monastery is a masterpiece of the baroque era.

The Benedictine monks live here according to the rule of their order and the main principle "Ora et Labora", meaning pray and work. The monastery is home of a brewery and a distillery where the famous beers and liqueurs from Ettal are carefully crafted. Monastic hospitality can be found in the abbey hotel "Ludwig der Bayer" with its regional cuisine, the historic ambience for conferences and incentives and the wellness oasis "Vitalia".

The activities of the monks of Ettal secure the upkeep of the centuries old buildings and art treasures as well as the running of the benediction school with its humanistic education tradition.

HOHENSCHWANGALI

MOST BELOVED PLACE OF THE BAVARIAN KINGS

Hohenschwangau Castle was constructed by King Maximilian II of Bavaria as a holiday house. His son King Ludwig II spent most of his life in Hohenschwangau Castle. Surrounded from lakes and mountains he got his inspirations for art and music and for his further projects. Many guests visited the family here, such as the Russian Zar Alexander II, the German Emperior Wilhelm I and many Kings. The danish fairytale author Hans Christian Andersen was here and read out fairytales for the young princes Ludwig and Otto. Hohenschwangau Castle was often used as film set for movies or tv-series, recently for the thai lakorn "Likit Ruk – The Crown Princess" which got the award of the most talked Asianovela in 2019. So far it was broadcasted in Thailand, China, Vietnam, Cambodia and on the Philippines.

A real inside tipp is the **Museum of the Bavarian Kings**. Explore the history of the most important and oldest dynasties in Europe – the Wittelsbach family – Admire the further projects of King Ludwig II on big screens in breathtaking 3D animations like the cable car up to Hohenschwangau castle, the chinese summer palace or the bycantine palace which the genius King planned, but never could be realized.

SALT MINING SINCE 1517

The Berchtesgaden Salt Mine is located in the central Berchtesgaden Alps, with a sensational panoramic view of the mighty Mount Watzmann. Berchtesgaden is also just 30 minutes away from Salzburg city center.

Since opening in 1517, it remains a unique chronicle of 500 years of uninterrupted salt mining. Become immersed in the world of "white gold" and experience the amazing atmosphere of mining in the depths of the Alps. The mine's railway, separated from the mining area by only a rock face, takes you 650 m deep into the mountain, where you'll find the cavernous Salt Cathedral and the spectacular Miner's Slide. The one hour tour of the mine provides an exclusive look back at the history of Berchtesgaden salt and also German engineering. The highlights of the underground tour are two wooden miner's slides, the magic salt room, the mirror lake and much more to experience. After the guided underground tour do not miss to visit our salt and souvenir shop with unique miner's rock salt products.
