Day 1 Munich:

Arrival at Munich Airport:

Meet & Greet

Private Transfer to the hotel in downtown Munich

Overview walking tour of Munich and food stop at the Viktualienmarkt:

Your guide will show you Munich's cultural and historical highlights. You will meet vendors at the food market, discover unknown traditions in the beer halls, and experience Munich up close.

Visit the bustling Marienplatz, where the ornate New Town Hall is home to the famous "Glockenspiel," a chime featuring 59 bells and medieval-dressed figurines that move daily to depict two key city events. Visit the Gothic Church of Our Dear Lady (Frauenkirche) and hear the legend of how it was founded and why it was considered one of the world's wonders. Follow your guide to the Viktualienmarkt, Germany's largest food market, where you'll find a wide array of delicacies. Get a feel for Bavarian snacks, such as white sausage or Leberkäs, and meet some local vendors. Just a few minutes away is the Hofbräuhaus, Germany's biggest and most famous beer hall, with its live music and coexistence of tourists and real Bavarians.

Continue to the mighty royal residence where the Bavarian dukes, electors, and kings have lived for over 400 years. Meanwhile, it is the largest museum in the State of Bavaria. It is a place to visit if you are interested in arts and crafts, porcelain, Rococo interior, or art history.

Day 2 Garmisch – Partenkirchen :

Private Transfer from Hotel in Munich to Hotel in Garmisch–Partenkirchen

Visit the Zugspitze:

Upon arrival in Garmisch-Partenkirchen, you will visit the Zugspitze, Germany's highest peak, first.

During the summer, it is an extraordinary experience that combines stunning alpine landscapes, outdoor activities, and the chance to enjoy breathtaking views without the cold of winter. Once at the top, you'll be treated to 360-degree views of the Alps, spanning four countries—Germany, Austria, Italy, and Switzerland—on a clear day.

A short hike (if you're comfortable with heights) leads you to the iconic golden cross that marks the true summit of the Zugspitze. It's an excellent spot for taking photos and marveling at your surroundings.

There are several places to relax and enjoy a meal with a view. The Panorama 2962 restaurant offers delicious Bavarian specialties, such as Käsespätzle (cheesy noodles) or fresh Alpine salads, all while you take in the spectacular scenery.

This is also where the famous Chapel of Visitation (Kapelle Maria Heimsuchung) is located—a quaint and peaceful place for a moment of reflection.

Going back down by cable car:

Cable Car Descent: After enjoying the views from the summit, you can descend using the Seilbahn Zugspitze (Zugspitze Cable Car), which takes you directly down to the Eibsee, a beautiful lake at the base of the mountain.

Spectacular Views: The cable car offers stunning panoramic views of the Alps and the valleys below, making it a breathtaking way to end your visit.

Private transfer to your hotel.

1 h walking tour to the Old Town of Garmisch-Partenkirchen:

After a break and time to refresh, your guide will pick you up for a private walking tour.

Old town Garmisch-Partenkirchen fulfills all your German fantasies. Picturesque half-timbered houses display murals typical of the area. Look for the Biedermeier frescoes on the houses and see the wooden houses, which are almost 400 years old. Enjoy the Gemütlichkeit (cozy, friendly atmosphere) and let the urge to yodel take hold as you stroll along the River Loisach.

Day 3 Ettal and Füssen:

Visit the Ettal Abbey and the brewery, incl. beer tasting:

Your private driver guide picks you up at your hotel. On the way to Füssen, you stop after 30 minutes at Ettal Abbey. The Benedictine monastery is situated in the picturesque village of Ettal, Bavaria, Germany. Founded in 1330 by Emperor Ludwig IV, it is a significant cultural and religious site. The abbey is renowned for its stunning baroque architecture, including the Basilica of the Assumption of Mary, which features breathtaking frescoes and intricate designs.

Visitors can explore the monastery grounds, which include a brewery and distillery where monks have been producing beer and liqueurs for centuries. The abbey also features a cheese dairy and a monastery shop that offers a selection of local products.

An exclusive visit to the Ettal Brewery offers a rich cultural and sensory experience in the heart of the Bavarian Alps. The brewery, part of the historic Ettal Abbey founded in 1330, has been producing monastic beer for centuries, using traditional methods refined by the Benedictine monks.

You are guided through the brewing facilities, where you can see the large copper kettles, fermentation tanks, and cellars where the beer is aged. The tour explains the process from selecting the finest Bavarian ingredients to the brewing techniques passed down through generations. You'll learn about the different types of beer brewed here, such as Ettaler Kloster Dunkel, Ettaler Kloster Hell, and their seasonal brews.

Beer Tasting: After the tour, the highlight of the visit is the beer tasting. In a cozy tasting room or beer garden, visitors sample various Ettal's craft beers. Each beer is paired with explanations about its ingredients, brewing process, and unique flavor profiles. You can enjoy everything from a light Helles to a full-bodied Dunkel, experiencing the authentic taste of traditional Bavarian beer.

Private transfer to the castle area.

Visit the Hohenschwangau Castle:

Upon arrival, walk up to Hohenschwangau Castle. It was first mentioned in records dating back to the 12th century. Until the 16th century, its owners were the knights of Schwangau. It changed hands several times over the following period and was partially destroyed during various wars. In 1832, the later King Maximilian II, father of King Ludwig II, acquired the ruin and had the castle rebuilt according to the original plans. After its completion, it was used as the summer and hunting residence of the Bavarian royal family. In his whole life, the famous Bavarian King Ludwig II. spent a few weeks each summer in Hohenschwangau.

Public guided tour of the castle Neuschwanstein:

Just across Hohenschwangau Castle is the famous fairy-tale castle of King Ludwig II. Castle Neuschwanstein is one of the most visited and photographed sights in Germany. The idyllic castle was constructed in 1869 on behalf of the shy and eccentric King Ludwig II, who had this castle built to escape public life. With its medieval look, furnishings, decoration, and artwork, it served as a means for the king to escape real life and be part of a poetic dream world.

After his passing in 1886, the castle was opened to the public. Walt Disney visited this place and used it as inspiration for the castle of Cinderella and Sleeping Beauty in Disneyland. Due to the King's early death, only 15 exclusively adorned rooms are fully finished and can be visited on the Castle tour.

Day 4 Innsbruck :

Your private driver guide picks you up at your hotel. The drive to Innsbruck takes two hours.

On your 2-hour private walking tour, you will see the must-see attractions:

The Goldenes Dachl (Golden Roof) is located in the Old Town (Altstadt) section of Innsbruck. It is

considered the city's most famous symbol. Emperor Maximilian I and his wife used the balcony to observe festivals, tournaments, and other events that took place in the square below around 1500.

City Tower: Climb 133 steps for a panoramic view over the medieval town and surrounding mountains.

The Court Church: Famous for Emperor Maximilian's impressive black bronze statues and ornate tombs.

Imperial Palace: One of Austria's most important historical buildings with lavish Rococo interiors and Habsburg history.

After your tour, you have time to explore Innsbruck by yourself. Enjoy an Apple strudel, try Tyrolian speck, visit the Alpine Zoo, or stay on the funicular and visit Mt. Hafelekarspitze.

Visit of the Tyrolean evening folk show:

In the evening, attend a Tyrolean Evening Folk Show. It is a vibrant celebration of traditional Tyrolean culture, held in Innsbruck's downtown area. This lively event features authentic Tyrolean music, folk dances, and the famous "Schuhplattler" dance, a fast-paced and energetic performance. Guests can also enjoy yodeling and other traditional songs that have been passed down through generations. The show is hosted by the Gundolf family, who have been organizing these events since 1967.

Day 5 Berchtesgaden:

Your private driver guide picks you up at your hotel. The drive to Berchtesgaden takes three hours.

Only 30 minutes outside of Innsbruck is the small town of Wattens, where the headquarters of Swarovski are located.

Visit the Swarovski Crystal World:

Swarovski Crystal Worlds is a museum and tourist attraction created by the crystal manufacturer Swarovski. It features stunning art installations, sculptures, and exhibits showcasing the beauty and versatility of Swarovski crystals.

Once inside, explore the various attractions, including the Chambers of Wonder, a series of art installations created by different artists using Swarovski crystals. Don't miss the iconic Giant, a unique art installation that serves as a symbol of the Swarovski Crystal Worlds.

Carry on to Berchtesgaden.

Visit the Salt Mines, Berchtesgaden

The Salt Mine Berchtesgaden has been in uninterrupted operation since 1517. Salt deposits are proven to be up to 980 ft below the valley floor in the area of the Salt Mine. Salt does not occur in a pure form, but rather, is encased in the "Haselgebirge". This composite rock contains an average of

50% salt. It is released from the mountain with the aid of freshwater using a “wet mining” method. Sparkling atmospherically and impressively adventurously, the Salt Mine shines in a new light. It is a world of the local miners, who have been working in the active part of the Salt Mine day in, day out, for centuries and whisk the visitors away into their aforementioned world. Highlights, such as the slide or the journey to Mirror Lake (Spiegelsee), merge with gripping information about the indispensable vital element of salt. An adventure with many unforgettable impressions, which you not only experience during the SaltTimeJourney in Berchtesgaden, but will also experience with all of your senses!

Take a trip through salt and time in the Salt Mine Berchtesgaden and be a part of the mysterious tour underground, during which you can be astounded by the fascinating, wonderful world of the “white gold”. Before entering each group in the salt mine in Berchtesgaden, functional overalls are pulled over to protect their clothing. Please note that the temperature underground is constant all year round 53° F.

Your driver will bring you to your hotel in Berchtesgaden.

City Tour in Berchtesgaden:

Your guide will pick you up for a one-hour private tour through the town. Stroll through the winding streets lined with pastel buildings decorated with "Luftmalerei" paintings, browse the wood carvings and Bavarian clothes in the shops, and stop at one of the many cafes with outdoor seating to enjoy Bavarian specialties and beer or Kaffee und Kuchen (pastries).

Just beyond the Markt is the Schlossplatz, an open area in front of the pink royal residence of the Wittelsbach family, who ruled the Berchtesgadener Land for many centuries.

The church attached to it, the Stiftkirche, was built in the 12th century, and some of the medieval portions and cloisters remain. The palace (Schloss) and the church are open to the public.

Day 6 Salzburg:

Your private driver guide picks you up at your hotel. The drive to Salzburg takes 30 minutes.

Private walking tour of Salzburg - Mozart and Sound of Music:

Meet your guide for a 3-hour private walking tour of Salzburg. The city is known worldwide as the birthplace of the famous composer Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. This relatively small and quaint town, also known as the “Rome of the North,” is all about classical music, nature, and history. The historic city center's numerous architectural jewels have been listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1996.

The city walk includes Mozart's Birthplace, Getreidegasse, St. Peter's cemetery, and Mirabell Palace. During the tour, you will be visiting the sites where the movie “The Sound of Music” was filmed in 1965.

After your tour, you have time to explore Salzburg by yourself. Enjoy an Original Salzburger Mozartkugel , visit Hohensalzburg Fortress or Kapuziner abby with a fabulous view over the city.

Mozart Dinner Concert:

By visiting the performance you will be taken back to Mozart's time. Enjoy an evening that is likely to have taken place in 1790 - in the Baroque Hall, lit by candles, featuring a dinner based on historical recipes, a concert with musicians in authentic costumes, and music by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. The Baroque Hall is part of the renowned Benedictine monastery of St. Peter, located in the heart of Salzburg. It's one of the last concert halls in Salzburg where real candlelight is still lit up. Enjoy a unique three-course dinner, based on 18th-century recipes, served during concert intermissions. Savor the very finest cuisine in the oldest restaurant in Europe. Experience arias and duets from "Magic Flute", "Figaro," and "Don Giovanni", as well as "A Little Night Music" performed by Amadeus Consort Salzburg

Day 7 Chiemsee:

Take the boat on the Chiemsee:

You will visit the Herreninsel and Fraueninsel.

Herreninsel (Men's Island):

Start your journey on the largest island in Lake Chiemsee, home to the magnificent Herrenchiemsee Palace. This palace, built by King Ludwig II of Bavaria, is often referred to as the "Bavarian Versailles" due to its grandeur and opulence. Wander on a public palace tour through its lavish interiors, adorned with gold accents and grand chandeliers, and explore the beautifully landscaped gardens surrounding it. Don't miss the Augustinian Monastery, which has been transformed into a museum showcasing the island's history. The tranquil walking paths offer stunning views of the lake and the distant Alps, perfect for a peaceful stroll.

Fraueninsel (Women's Island):

This smaller, picturesque island radiates charm and serenity. Fraueninsel is home to the Benedictine Abbey of Frauenwörth, an active convent with a history dating back over 1,200 years. The island's quaint village atmosphere is complemented by its artisan shops, where you can find locally produced crafts, and its cozy restaurants serving fresh fish caught right from the lake. Walk along the idyllic shoreline and take in the beautiful vistas of the surrounding lake and mountains. Fraueninsel offers a glimpse into traditional Bavarian culture with its unique blend of history and natural beauty.
